AMENDMENT intended to be proposed by Mr. RUBIO

Viz:

1 At the end, add the following:

2 **SEC. 3. PROHIBITION ON PROVIDING SANCTIONS RELIEF.**

3 The President, the Secretary of the Treasury, the
4 Secretary of State, and any other Executive branch officer
5 or agency may not waive, suspend, reduce, provide relief
6 from, or otherwise limit the application of statutory sanc-
7 tions with respect to Iran under any provision of law or
8 refrain from applying any such sanctions pursuant to an
9 agreement described under section 135(a) of the Atomic
10 Energy Act of 1954, as added by section 2 of this Act,

1 until the President certifies to Congress that the Govern-
2 ment of Iran has fully and verifiably—

3 (1) reduced by approximately two-thirds its in-
4 stalled centrifuges, with the remaining 6,104 cen-
5 trifuges being IR-1s, Iran's first-generation cen-
6 trifuge;

7 (2) halted any uranium enrichment over 3.67
8 percent and agreed to continue to do so for at least
9 15 years;

10 (3) reduced its stockpile of low-enriched ura-
11 nium to 300 kilograms of 3.67 percent low-enriched
12 uranium (LEU);

13 (4) placed all excess centrifuges and enrichment
14 infrastructure in International Atomic Energy Agen-
15 cy (IAEA) monitored storage to be used only as re-
16 placements for operating centrifuges and equipment;

17 (5) agreed to not build any new facilities for the
18 purpose of enriching uranium for 15 years;

19 (6) halted enrichment of uranium at the
20 Fordow facility and agreed to continue this morato-
21 rium for 15 years;

22 (7) converted the Fordow facility into a nuclear,
23 physics, technology, and research center for peaceful
24 purposes only;

1 (8) halted research and development associated
2 with uranium enrichment at Fordow and agreed to
3 continue this moratorium for 15 years;

4 (9) removed almost two-thirds of Fordow's cen-
5 trifuges and infrastructure, ensured that the remain-
6 ing centrifuges are not enriching uranium, and
7 placed all centrifuges and related infrastructure
8 under IAEA monitoring;

9 (10) removed advanced centrifuges at Natanz,
10 and is only enriching uranium using IR-1 models
11 and has agreed to continue this arrangement for 10
12 years;

13 (11) removed the 1,000 IR-2M centrifuges cur-
14 rently installed at Natanz and placed them in IAEA-
15 monitored storage and agreed to keep them there for
16 10 years;

17 (12) halted use of its IR-2, IR-4, IR-5, IR-6, or
18 IR-8 models to produce enriched uranium and com-
19 mitted to continue this for at least ten years.

20 (13) begun to abide by the schedule and param-
21 eters for limited centrifuge research and develop-
22 ment agreed to by the P5+1 countries;

23 (14) provided regular access to all of Iran's nu-
24 clear facilities, including to Iran's enrichment facility
25 at Natanz and its former enrichment facility at

1 Fordow, and is allowing the use of the most up-to-
2 date, modern monitoring technologies;

3 (15) provided inspectors with access to the sup-
4 ply chain that supports Iran's nuclear program;

5 (16) provided access to uranium mines and con-
6 tinuous surveillance at uranium mills, where Iran
7 produces yellowcake, and has committed to continue
8 to do so for 25 years;

9 (17) provided inspectors with access to allow
10 continuous surveillance of Iran's centrifuge rotors
11 and bellows production and storage facilities, and
12 has committed to continue to do so for 20 years;

13 (18) placed all centrifuges and enrichment in-
14 frastructure removed from Fordow and Natanz
15 under continuous monitoring by the IAEA;

16 (19) begun to use only the dedicated procure-
17 ment channel for Iran's nuclear program to monitor
18 and approve, on a case by case basis, the supply,
19 sale, or transfer to Iran of certain nuclear-related
20 and dual use materials and technology;

21 (20) implemented the Additional Protocol of the
22 IAEA and committed to adhere to the Additional
23 Protocol permanently;

24 (21) committed to grant access to the IAEA to
25 investigate any suspicious sites or allegations of a

1 covert enrichment facility, conversion facility, cen-
2 trifuge production facility, or yellowcake production
3 facility anywhere in the country, including at mili-
4 tary sites;

5 (22) implemented Modified Code 3.1 requiring
6 early notification of construction of new facilities;

7 (23) redesigned and rebuilt the heavy water re-
8 search reactor in Arak based on a design agreed to
9 by the P5+1 countries and ensured that the reactor
10 will not produce weapons grade plutonium;

11 (24) destroyed or removed from the country the
12 original core of the Arak reactor;

13 (25) committed to ship all spent fuel from the
14 Arak reactor out of the country;

15 (26) halted any reprocessing or reprocessing re-
16 search and development on spent nuclear fuel;

17 (27) committed to not accumulate heavy water
18 in excess of the needs of the modified Arak reactor,
19 and to sell any remaining heavy water on the inter-
20 national market for 15 years; and

21 (28) halted building of any additional heavy
22 water reactors and committed to continue this mora-
23 torium for 15 years.
