A BILL

To require the Comptroller General of the United States to submit to Congress a report on initiatives of the Department of Defense to source locally and regionally produced foods for consumption or distribution at installations of the Department of Defense.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Farm to Base Food
5 Security Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. REPORT ON INITIATIVES OF DEPARTMENT OF DE-**
2 **FENSE TO SOURCE LOCALLY AND REGION-**
3 **ALLY PRODUCED FOODS FOR INSTALLA-**
4 **TIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than one year after the
6 date of the enactment of this Act, the Comptroller General
7 of the United States shall submit to the appropriate com-
8 mittees of Congress a report detailing—

9 (1) current procurement practices of the De-
10 partment of Defense regarding food for consumption
11 or distribution on installations of the Department;

12 (2) efforts by the Department of Defense to es-
13 tablish and strengthen “farm to base” initiatives to
14 source locally and regionally produced foods, includ-
15 ing seafood, for consumption or distribution at in-
16 stallations of the Department;

17 (3) efforts by the Department to collaborate
18 with relevant Federal agencies, including the De-
19 partment of Veterans Affairs, the Department of
20 Agriculture, and the Department of Commerce, to
21 procure locally and regionally produced foods;

22 (4) opportunities where procurement of locally
23 and regionally produced foods would be beneficial to
24 members of the Armed Forces, their families, mili-
25 tary readiness by improving health outcomes, and
26 farmers near installations of the Department;

1 (5) barriers currently preventing the Department
2 from increasing procurement of locally and re-
3 gionally produced foods or preventing producers
4 from partnering with nearby installations of the De-
5 partment; and

6 (6) recommendations for how the Department
7 can improve procurement practices to increase offer-
8 ings of locally and regionally produced foods.

9 (b) APPROPRIATE COMMITTEES OF CONGRESS DE-
10 FINED.—In this section, the term “appropriate commit-
11 tees of Congress” means—

12 (1) the Committee on Armed Services, the
13 Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transpor-
14 tation, and the Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition,
15 and Forestry of the Senate; and

16 (2) the Committee on Armed Services, the
17 Committee on Natural Resources, and the Com-
18 mittee on Agriculture of the House of Representa-
19 tives.
