A BILL

To provide emergency supplemental appropriations in response to the crisis in Ukraine, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Ukraine Emergency
5 Appropriations Act of 2022”.

6 **SEC. 2. EMERGENCY APPROPRIATIONS FOR DEPARTMENT**
7 **OF DEFENSE ASSISTANCE.**

8 (a) PROVISION OF DEFENSE ASSISTANCE TO
9 UKRAINE.—There is appropriated, out of any money in
10 the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, \$1,000,000,000

1 to the Secretary of Defense for fiscal year 2022, to remain
2 available until September 30, 2024, for “Procurement,
3 Defense-wide” to provide the Government of Ukraine the
4 following:

5 (1) Small arms, grenade launchers, and ammu-
6 nition previously allocated for provision to Afghan
7 Security Forces under the Afghan Security Forces
8 Fund.

9 (2) Man-portable missiles and rockets in a
10 ready-to-fire configuration, including Dragon, Jav-
11 elin, FIM-92 Stinger Missiles, and other light anti-
12 tank weapons (66mm), shoulder-launched multi-pur-
13 pose assault weapon rockets (83mm), M136 (AT4)
14 anti-armor launchers, and cartridges (84mm).

15 (3) Night vision devices, including fused pano-
16 ramic night vision goggles, squad binocular night vi-
17 sion goggles, and night vision and thermal and infra-
18 red sights for crew-served weapons.

19 (4) Unmanned aerial vehicles (tactical and
20 armed) and crew-served weapons ammunition with
21 low-light and infrared night sights.

22 (5) Secure, commercial-off-the-shelf commu-
23 nications capabilities, including hand-held secure
24 communications devices.

25 (6) Individual protective equipment.

1 (7) Field rations.

2 (8) Field medical kits.

3 (b) PROVISION OF DEFENSE ASSISTANCE TO NORTH
4 ATLANTIC TREATY ORGANIZATION MEMBERS.—There is
5 appropriated, out of any money in the Treasury not other-
6 wise appropriated, \$1,000,000,000 to the Secretary of De-
7 fense for fiscal year 2022, to remain available until Sep-
8 tember 30, 2024, for “Procurement, Defense-wide” to
9 provide the Governments of Poland, Lithuania, Latvia,
10 Estonia and other members of the North Atlantic Treaty
11 Organization with planes, tanks, munitions, and anti-air
12 and anti-tank weaponry to bolster the deterrence efforts
13 of those Governments against an invasion by the Russian
14 Federation and to replace equipment donated by those
15 Governments to the Government of Ukraine.

16 (c) PROCUREMENT OF REPLACEMENT DEFENSE AR-
17 TICLES.—

18 (1) IN GENERAL.—There is appropriated, out
19 of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appro-
20 priated, \$1,000,000,000 to the Secretary of Defense
21 for fiscal year 2022, to remain available until ex-
22 pended, for “Procurement” to procure defense arti-
23 cles to replace defense articles transferred to
24 Ukraine and members of the North Atlantic Treaty
25 Organization.

1 (2) DEFINITION OF DEFENSE ARTICLE.—In
2 this subsection, the term “defense article” has the
3 meaning given that term in section 47 of the Arms
4 Export Control Act (22 U.S.C. 2794).

5 (d) UNITED STATES DEFENSE AGAINST
6 CYBERATTACKS.—There is appropriated, out of any
7 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated,
8 \$1,000,000,000 to the Secretary of Defense for fiscal year
9 2022, to remain available until expended, for “Operation
10 and Maintenance, Defense-wide” to enhance the capability
11 of the Department of Defense to defend against a
12 cyberattack originating in the Russian Federation or
13 Belarus that targets critical infrastructure of the United
14 States or the ability of the United States to retaliate
15 against a nuclear attack.

16 (e) HUMANITARIAN OPERATIONS TO SUPPORT
17 UKRAINE.—There is appropriated, out of any money in
18 the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, \$400,000,000 to
19 the Secretary of Defense for fiscal year 2022, to remain
20 available until expended, for “Overseas Humanitarian,
21 Disaster, and Civic Aid” to conduct delivery of humani-
22 tarian assistance to Ukraine.

1 **SEC. 3. EMERGENCY APPROPRIATIONS FOR DEPARTMENT**
2 **OF STATE ASSISTANCE.**

3 (a) INTERNATIONAL DISASTER ASSISTANCE.—There
4 is appropriated, out of any money in the Treasury not oth-
5 erwise appropriated, \$500,000,000 to the Secretary of
6 State for fiscal year 2022, to remain available until ex-
7 pended, for “International Disaster Assistance” to ad-
8 dress humanitarian needs in Ukraine due to the impact
9 caused by the Russian Federation’s invasion.

10 (b) MIGRATION AND REFUGEE ASSISTANCE.—There
11 is appropriated, out of any money in the Treasury not oth-
12 erwise appropriated, \$500,000,000 to the Secretary of
13 State for fiscal year 2022, to remain available until ex-
14 pended, for “Migration and Refugee Assistance” to assist
15 refugees from Ukraine.

16 (c) DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE.—There is appro-
17 priated, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise
18 appropriated, \$500,000,000 to the Secretary of State for
19 fiscal year 2022, to remain available until expended, for
20 “Development Assistance” to rebuild infrastructure in
21 Ukraine damaged by the Russian Federation’s invasion.

22 (d) ECONOMIC SUPPORT FUND.—There is appro-
23 priated, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise
24 appropriated, \$500,000,000, to the Secretary of State for
25 fiscal year 2022, to remain available until expended, for
26 “Economic Support Fund” assistance to support the revi-

1 talization of Ukraine’s economy after the Russian Federa-
2 tion’s invasion.

3 **SEC. 4. EMERGENCY DESIGNATION.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—The amounts provided by this Act
5 are designated as an emergency requirement pursuant to
6 section 4(g) of the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010
7 (2 U.S.C. 933(g)).

8 (b) DESIGNATION IN HOUSE AND SENATE.—This
9 Act is designated as an emergency requirement pursuant
10 to subsections (a) and (b) of section 4001 of S. Con. Res.
11 14 (117th Congress), the concurrent resolution on the
12 budget for fiscal year 2022.
